John Edwin, known as "Ed," was born and lived in Pawnee City, Nebraska. Little information is currently available of his early life. In 22 Jun 1892, he was married to Bertha Jane (known as "Bird") Brayman. They had three children: Maurice, Mildred and Max. At the time of his death he owned property in the country around Pawnee City and a greenhouse/nursery. Ed died of cancer. The picture at the top is actually his death bed picture. He passed away on Jan. 8, 1916.
